



2024 DVA DISASTER MANAGEMENT PLAN (DMP)

CONCEPT: The Village will be organized into 7 sectors to be led by a Governor to attend to and address emergency disaster relief and rescue operations before assistance from appropriate government and other relief agencies arrive.

For the purpose of implementing the DMP, a “disaster” is an event that is man-made or nature induced that results in village-wide inaccessibility of roads, destruction of infrastructure for telecommunications, electric power, potable water, chaos outside of the village perimeter because of riots, civil disobedience or disturbance, and violence in the streets whether requiring the closure of all village gates and/or stopping the breach by non-residents of its perimeter walls.

SECTORS: Subject to changes approved annually by the DVA Board, DVA President will take charge of **Sector 1** (Green). Vice-President will cover **Sector 2** (Yellow). Secretary will head **Sector 3** (Indigo). Treasurer will take charge of **Sector 4** (Blue). Governor 1 will cover **Sector 5** (Orange). Governor 2 will take charge of **Sector 6** (Violet), and Governor 3 to handle **Sector 7** (Red). Each sector will be designated with colors of the rainbow in the DVA map found in **p. 4**.

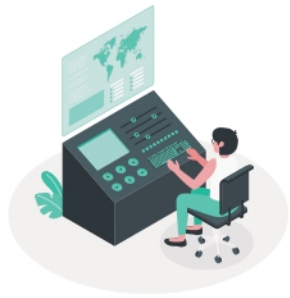
SPECIFICS: Governors will lead and take appropriate measures to alleviate the plight of residents within their sector should a disaster occur. They can be assisted by resident-street leaders or their representatives, designated resident-professionals from the medical, engineering, and technical professions to assist in attending to the elderly, injured, infirm, or structural aberrations within their respective sectors before government or other help arrives.

FUNCTION: Governors assigned to a sector will take full responsibility for the safety and general well-being of residents within their area for medical, safety concerns, and verification of structural aberrations including collapsed houses to address health, food, water, electric power, and other urgent concerns as a result of the disaster.

DVA Security and volunteer firefighters will provide immediate action for transportation. They will ensure perimeters of the Village are not breached so that no one takes advantage of the confusion arising from a disaster on property protection, residents’ safety, general consumer requirements, and medical evacuation as needed. They will liaise with Barangay officials to implement their own disaster management plan and to harmonize those with provisions of this DMP and directives from the DVA President.

Governors assigned to sectors have the duty to deploy resident-assistants, deputies, resident-medical workers, technical personnel from DVA, and organize triage stations to attend to all types of concerns. Priority should be given to the elderly, infirm, infants and their mothers, and those in need of emergency medical attention arising from old age or bodily injury. Psychiatrists and social workers available within the Village will be deployed as needed to provide aid and comfort to those in need of it.

All Sector Heads will assist other sectors adjacent to their areas to augment the help required to ensure that residents’ needs are attended to.



COMMAND AND CONTROL. DVA Board Room will be command and control (C&C) Center. DVA President will be Chairman for C&C with Vice-President as Deputy. All DVA supervisors and staff will take instructions from the C&C Chairman when the DMP is implemented. C&C functions cease when the Chairman declares the emergency lifted.



RALLYING POINT. In case the DVA Board Room is inaccessible or communication facilities lost, all Sector Heads will report to the Mahogany Park as Rallying Point (RP) to meet with the C&C Chairman for instructions and attendance to urgent requirements in their respective areas. RP will also be the main evacuation area should there be fire, earthquake, floodwater, volcanic eruption, and lawless violence that will engulf the Village. DVA Security will ensure that all roads leading to the RP is secure. DVA Board Room will continue to be C&C Center should it be available.



SIGNAL: Upon the occurrence of a disaster or other emergency where assistance from private or government help is inaccessible or unavailable, DVA Security Officer upon instruction of C&C Chairman will signal a general alarm consisting of a minute-long siren blast to warn all residents of the need to get instructions or help as needed from Sector Heads.



WATER SOURCE. Manila Water pumping stations in Pasay and Lumbang Roads and DVA firetrucks will be main water-sources. Replenishment will be obtained from accessible swimming pools of residents. Residents with swimming pools will be requested to augment requirements of these principal water sources.



ELECTRIC POWER SOURCE. Generator sets of residents in all sectors will be tapped for use by neighbors in need in their respective areas to charge cellular phones, rechargeable batteries, and other gadgets or equipment in need of them.



RESIDENTS' COOPERATION. Sector Heads or their representatives will request residents in their areas with access to stored potable water, raw water from underground sources, and electric power from gensets to extend full and unconditional cooperation to residents within their sectors when requested by the C&C Chairman or his representative.

TECHNICAL SUPPORT. Physicians, health workers, engineers, architects living within the Village, and skilled DVA personnel will provide full and unconditional support to residents in need of their services until the emergency is abated or disaster is declared terminated by the C&C Chairman.



LOGISTICAL SUPPORT. All DVA vehicles and equipment will be used to transport the injured, infirm, or any other resident in need of help to hospitals and other tertiary medical institutions of their choice (if accessible) to give them treatment, aid and comfort. Residents with vans, trucks, and other service vehicles will provide for their use by Sector Heads when requested to achieve the purpose of logistical support. Fuel for all equipment and gensets will be obtained from the Petron gas station along EDSA-Pasay Road or those safely-stored in homes of residents.



TERMINATION OF DMP. Upon the arrival or assistance extended by appropriate government and public/private utility agencies concerned, Sector Heads or their representatives will provide those responders with appropriate reports and recommendations on the state of their areas. Copies of the reports will be submitted to the Village Manager and filed accordingly.

There will be no let-up or transfer of jurisdiction from Sector Heads to any other agency or utility company until the latter takes-over function(s) of the existing emergency.



REPORTS. All Sector Heads are required to submit a comprehensive report to Village Manager on the state of their areas within 24 hours after the emergency or when the DMP is terminated by the C&C Chairman. All Sector Heads will meet with the C&C Chairman immediately after for debriefing and recommendations on adoption of best practices for future use. All reports will then be consolidated with the final copy being provided the City Mayor, NDRRC, DILG, and other concerned agencies both public and private.

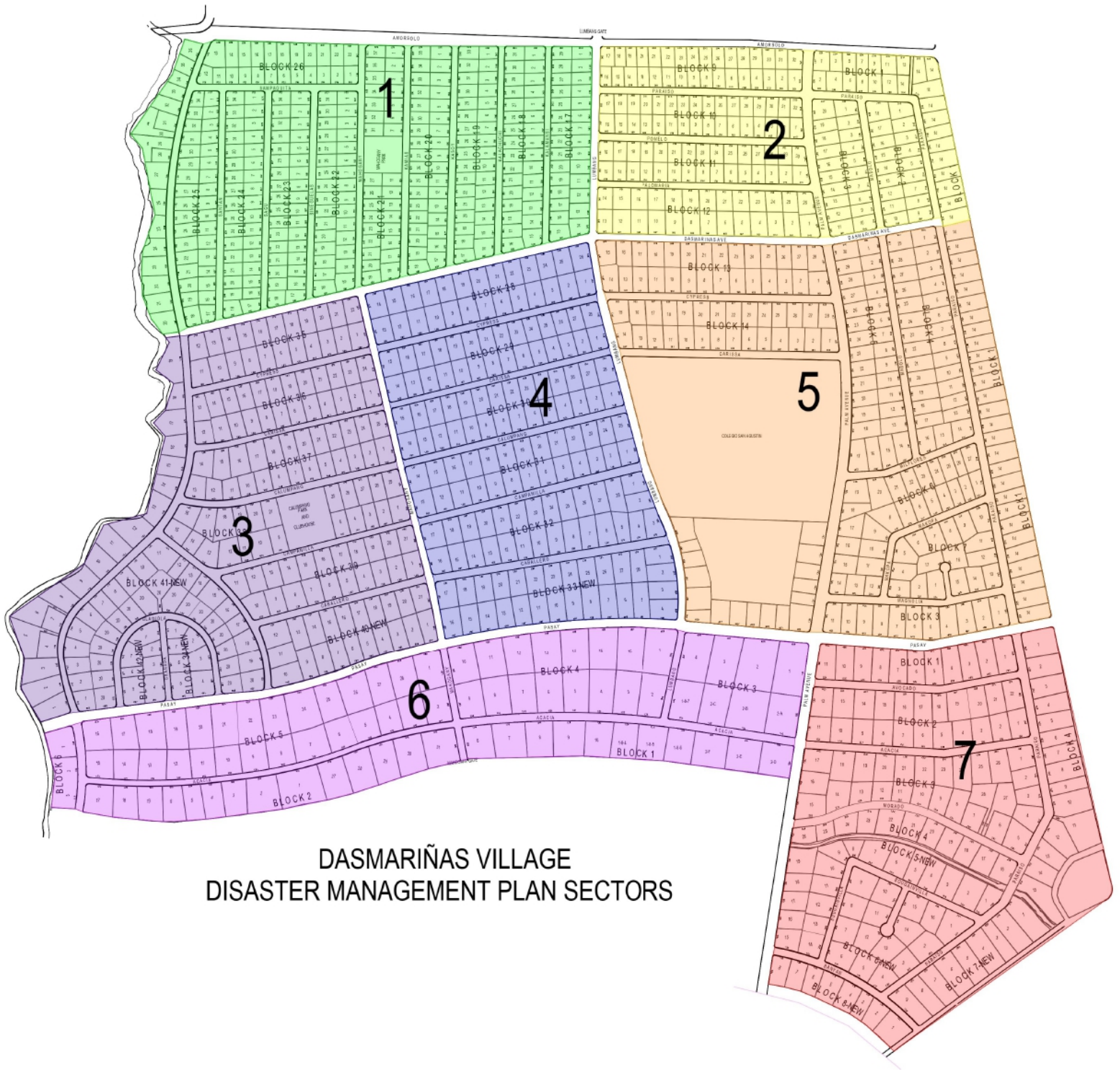
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DMP 7 SECTORS
